Clarington Votes

May 2009: Host Community Agreement vote which would make Clarington a "willing host" to an oversized incinerator.

This was a major turning point for Clarington. **ROBINSON'S** switch in position resulted in a willing host status.

July 6, 2009: Vote to terminate Clarington expert reviewers before the final Environmental Assessment completed.

As a result, Clarington did NOT review or submit ANY comments to the province on the Final or Amended EA.

March 2010: Vote to hear the municipal solicitor's report on legal concerns with the Host Community Agreement with Durham Region.

NO ABERNETHY, NOVAK, ROBINSON, TRIM

YES FOSTER, HOOPER, WOO

The Host Community Agreement was negotiated by Clarington and Durham Region staff with no public consultation.

Durham Region Votes

ABERNETHY and NOVAK voted to:

- Adopt Courtice as the preferred site (January 2008).
- Endorse business case which understated costs of the project at \$198 million (May 2008). Project cost has since escalated; reported as \$272 million in June 2009.
- Support an oversized incinerator based on *draft* documents. NO council review of draft contract with Covanta required before Regional Chair would sign (June 2009). The go-ahead vote was 16-12. Had ABERNETHY, NOVAK and TRIM voted against the proposal, the incinerator project would not have proceeded
