The peer review expenditures included that a Toronto lawyer billed Durham Region 206.7 hours at a cost of \$100,766.60 estimated at \$487.50 per hour in their review of the Clarington incineration project.

I applaud Oshawa Councillor John Henry, who objected that the bill was excessive. The \$100,766.60 in legal costs for just over five 40-hour weeks is short of criminal.

People are being forced to compete and find ways to reduce spending and this should include our politicians and lawyers. Yes, I support the Clarington incineration, but let's not go burning up taxpayers dollars to get the job done.
