We, the undersigned Orono residents, are vehemently opposed to Mayor Abernethy cutting Jim Richards' delegation short on April 26th because he said that in his opinion our Regional Chair (Roger Anderson) was a bully. Mr. Richards has a right to his opinion and in a democracy, he has the right to express that opinion.

Whether we agree with Richards or not is not the question. What is at stake here is our highly cherished fundamental rights as stated in the Canadian Charter of Rights. The Mayor or Council have no legal right to curtail freedom of speech in this case.
